The Life of Water in the Megalong Valley

Megalong Public School was successful in gaining a NSW Eco Grant from the Sustainable Schools Grants Round 4 Program. This work has been undertaken and we look forward to implementing the teaching and learning programs early in 2024. We received resources from the Penrith Lakes Environmental Education Kitchen Garden Centre. A 10,000Ltr water tank was plumbed to the COLA downpipes. This water will be used to provide water to our new self-wicking raised garden beds and new garden tap. The wicking beds replaced old play ground equipment in the area behind the classroom. We will be including the school community next year in establishing fruit trees and vegetable crops for harvesting to use in our kitchen garden programs.













Students were excited to have a visit from Ms Wendy Hawkes. She was a constant and supportive classroom teacher in terms 1-3 this year.

Wendy guided the students in the art of nature journalling and inspired them to make many wonderful artworks. Their artwork gained recognition at the Lithgow show and the Wabi Sabi artwork they created as a class project won the district Waste to Art Show in their Category. It was lovely to see Wendy again and we look forward to welcoming her back for some casual days next year.


