Students have been learning about positive mindsets and goal setting. We start each day with our Bounce Back resilience program which is enjoyable and focuses on self-care. Our integration of Child Protection throughout each term, resilience and goal setting will increase students self-esteem, safety and increases our positive wellbeing at Megalong Public School.

Student and teachers are busy ensuring we all are focusing on our learning goals for the week. Our focus this term is to develop our confidence to speak in front of others and increase our reading fluency. The opportunity for students to visit Kookaburra preschool for Anzac activities went very well. Clancy presented with confidence a report about the local history of an Aboriginal soldier. This visit beginning a partnership for our school with Early Childhood as part of the Aboriginal Partnership Agreement. We appreciated the visit from Elder Uncle Graeme who joined us at the preschool. Our Anzac craft wreath was placed at the Blackheath memorial which was unfortunately a small event due to Covid-19. Thank you to Uncle Graeme and Kerrie from Kookaburra Preschool.

In addition students enjoyed to visit Radio Blue Mountains with Patrick radio presenter was an excellent experience for our year two students. Patrick said we had comments from the public asking how old she was to be reading so well. What a superb effort Clancy, well done!

We all had a wonderful time on the excursion to the Sydney Writers Festival, and staff on the professional development workshop at the New South Wales Maths Association. Students enjoyed a very entertaining performance and were extremely lucky to meet Emily Rhodda afterwards for a book signing. We will be using some of these texts in our film and literacy lessons this term. Teachers valued current teaching methods at the Maths Association workshop which will increase student deeper mathematical thinking in the classroom. We will be applying these enrichment activities into our classroom over the next few terms.


