Covid school update -

Vaccinations for school staff - To ensure a COVID-safe return to school, all NSW public school and preschool staff on-site to support the staged return of students will be required to be fully vaccinated. Any contractors, volunteers or people on site who require a Working with Children Check will also be required to have 2 doses of vaccination before returning to our school. All NSW school and preschool staff will be required to be fully vaccinated by 8 November.

Face masks - Teachers and all school staff are required to wear face-masks while in enclosed spaces with other people and whilst interacting with students on the playground. It is mandatory for all students in Year 7 or above to wear face masks while at school. Primary school students are encouraged to wear a face mask. This means if you want your child to wear a mask, they can. Students will also be reminded to practice good hand hygiene at school with our ample supplies of hand-sanitiser. If you would like your child to wear a mask at school we have access to disposable masks.

I sincerely hope that the spring term break gives you lots of time to rest, recharge and spend lots of quality time with your children. Enjoy that sunshine and the beautiful environment that you live in.

Have a very happy, safe spring holiday vacation! Students resume for Term 4 (remote learning from home) on Tuesday, 5th October, 2021.
